Fill up at our new standpipes!

In addition to the 27 standpipes that are currently operating across our region, Goldenfields Water have invested approximately \$180,000 into three brand new automated stations that will allow farmers or bulk water users access to water supply 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.

The three new standpipes will be located at:

- Temora
- Barmedman
- West Wyalong

The standpipes will operate as a pre-paid account, giving customers the ability to 'top up' their 'iButton' online. All customers wanting to utilise this service will need to set up a standpipe account at our Temora office.

The filling station will be a fixed freestanding arrangement with a 75mm (3 inch) outlet and will have the capacity to fill 10 litres per second. All users will need to supply their own hose and a 75mm female camlock fitting. The Temora standpipe has been operating since mid April whilst the Barmedman and West Wyalong standpipes are expected to be operating in May.

Mandamah update

Construction of the Scheme's two reservoirs were completed in December 2018, taking Hornick Constructions Pty Ltd six months to finalise the works. Each reservoir has the capability to store 650,000 litres of water.

Works on the Reefton Pump Station upgrade will commence in late April. This will enable water supply to the Mandamah reservoirs from the trunk main and the upgrade is expected to be completed in the coming months.

A total of 45 kilometres of pipeline has been laid, with Stage 1 expected to be completed by the end of 2019/20 financial year. The Mandamah scheme is on schedule and set for completion by the end of financial year 2022/23.

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
