

Opening of new Temora facility marks 20 year milestone for Goldenfields Water

A modern, purpose-built workshop facility will be unveiled next week by Goldenfields Water as it marks 20 years since being formed to provide water supply services in the South West Slopes and Riverina regions.

The Peter ‘Scruff’ McNuff building – named in memory of a valued workmate and close friend to Goldenfields Water’s staff – will be officially opened by Federal Member for Riverina the Hon. Michael McCormack MP on Monday 26 June 2017.

General Manager Phillip Rudd said the new facility ensures Goldenfields Water can meet the increasing demands on the water supply network over the next 20 years and beyond.

“This facility gives us the capacity to manufacture and repair infrastructure more efficiently as well as develop innovative solutions for the network.

“It includes an overhead crane to boost the site’s functionality and associated store, office and amenity facilities.

“Importantly, access to resources and technology such as this means we can deliver better services to the over 45,000 people that depend on us each day for their water,” Mr Rudd said.

A garden in front of the workshop has also been named the John B McGregor Memorial Garden to celebrate one of Goldenfields Water’s original Board members.

“Mr McGregor tirelessly served as the former Young Shire delegate from the day our organisation was proclaimed in 1997.

“Sadly John passed away in 2015, but we are pleased this memorial garden will ensure his legacy lives on,” Mr Rudd added.
