# 9.1.3 QUARTERLY BUDGET REVIEW – MARCH 2010 (G35201005)

**10/026 RESOLVED** on the motion of Crs Mangelsdorf and Macaulay that the Budget Review for the period ended 31 March 2010 be adopted with the variations to income and expenditure duly noted.

#### Report prepared by Manager Administration

This report is presented to Council to revise estimates of income and expenditure in accordance with clause 203 of the Local Government (General) Regulation 2005. The review is for the quarter ending 31 March 2010 and is attached for Council's consideration.

At the December Review Council's budget result showed a surplus of \$343,064. The March QBR result, as presented, reflects a loss of \$316,177 leaving a budgeted surplus result of \$26,887.

Major adjustments impacting on this review include: -

- ✓ Residential and Non-Residential Charges a combined loss of \$440,928 expected due to mitigating circumstances including original forecasting issues, the impact of best practice pricing, imposition of water restrictions and expected reductions in consumption resulting from good early season rain and the closure of the Young Abattoirs. This loss has been funded from the Sales Fluctuations reserve (resulting in an expected reserve balance at 30 June 2010 of \$911,000);
- ✓ Grants a gain of \$3,000 on Pensioner Subsidies Rebate based on year-to-date subsidies applied for;
- ✓ Headworks Contributions an expected loss of at least \$100,000 based upon contributions received year-to-date;
- ✓ Mains Operation Expenses an expected loss of \$110,000 due to additional resources being allocated to Water Quality and Testing budgets;
- ✓ Treatment Chemical Costs an increase of \$95,000 due to the quality of the water being extract from the Murrumbidgee River after recent rain events that has required additional chemical treatment. This revised estimated is based on the year-to-date expenditure trend;
- ✓ Miscellaneous Expenses adjustments to Private Works expenditure and Loss on Sale of Assets have negated each other. These adjustments have been instigated by the year-to-date trends;
- ✓ Carrying Amount of Assets Sold (Page 2) a vote increase of \$90,000 is the result of an under-estimate of the written down value of plant sold. This adjustment is offset by a reduction in the Transfer to Internally Restricted Assets (Plant & Equipment);
- Repayments from Deferred Debtors (Page 2) a gain \$6,416 resulting from an increase in staff housing loan repayments expected; and
- ✓ Acquisition of Assets (Page 2) a net gain of \$6,798,357 is a result of adjustments to the capital works programmed expenditure to 30 June 2010. The following is a summary of the capital projects are either postponed to future financial years or considered no longer necessary (denoted by an asterisk):

The difference of \$20,665 is for the purchase of Global Positioning equipment and is the subject of a separate report from the Manager Engineering for Council's consideration, elsewhere in the business paper.

The Cootamundra No.4 Pump Station upgrade has been determined not to be required in favour of making provision for a new station, more strategically placed, during the Cowangs to Bauloora Mains Replacement project. The pump station can be then easily added if the need arises in the future.

The \$6,819,022 gross gain is offset by a corresponding reduction in the Transfer from Internally Restricted Assets (Infrastructure Replacement reserve).

It is the Responsible Accounting Officer's opinion that the revised estimate of income and expenditure is such that the short term liquidity position of Council is satisfactory.

# Report prepared by Manager Administration

Councils are requested to provide the Division of Local Government with advice as to its compliance with regard to GST requirements before 1 June each year. The Division will then provide the advice to NSW Treasury for confirmation with the Commonwealth Commissioner of Taxation.

Initially Council's Auditor was required to undertake a GST Audit Review of Council's operations and certify Council's compliance with regard to GST requirements.

This requirement was changed for the 2004/05 financial year and beyond, and now Councils are required to supply their own certificate of confirmation to the Department in place of the Auditor's Review Report.

The following is an extract from the (former) Department of Local Government's communiqué to councils: -

By 8 June each year, the Commonwealth seeks from members of the GST Administration Subcommittee (GSTAS) advice on voluntary GST payments by local government bodies.

The timing of this request is to allow the Commonwealth Commissioner of Taxation to make a determination concerning the amount of GST collected in the financial year in question. Information sought by the Commonwealth is simply instances of where voluntary payments should have been, but were not, paid by local government bodies.

Accordingly, local governing bodies are requested to provide the department with this advice before 1 June each year. The department will then provide the advice to NSW Treasury for confirmation with the Commonwealth Commissioner of Taxation.

The certificate is to be signed by the Mayor, one other Councillor, the General Manager and the Responsible Accounting Officer (if the Responsible Accounting Officer is not the General Manager). The certificate is to be signed in accordance with a resolution of Council.

Given that Council will not meet again before the compliance date, a small liberty has been taken with regard to the reporting period.

#### **Report prepared by General Manager**

In accordance with Minute 10/003 of the February 2010 meeting a draft policy for the procurement of items of plant has been prepared and is attached. Also attached are copies of draft tender documents that are, subject to adoption by Council, to be used.

Historically the purchase and disposal of items of plant have been undertaken by the General Manager under delegated authority pursuant to Section 377 of the Local Government Act 1993. The underlying principle has been to provide best value for Council while still providing items of plant appropriate for the organisation to carry out its functions.

Ongoing changes to vehicle specifications, vehicle availability/delivery, market forces and Council's requirements mean that complying with standard guidelines is difficult thus requiring a degree of flexibility when making decisions. Vehicles are "housed" at various locations within Council's area and this also impacts on matters such as regular servicing, maintenance works and warranty work.

The replacement of sedans and station wagons within Councils fleet is relatively straight forward and generally comes down to the changeover price. However the vehicle requirements for field staff and heavy plant items are a little more complex.

Council's fleet include a number of excavators which are used for emergency works, and also used regularly as part of day to day operations. The list consists of two large (7 tonne) and six mini (1.6 tonne) excavators that are strategically placed at various depots within the GWCC area.

The two large excavators are transported to various locations on large trailers that are towed by one of the two 12 tonne tip truck within the fleet. The annual plant usage of these combinations is less than optimal but such combinations are essential for emergency situations.

The six small excavators are primarily to respond to emergency works in a timely manner but are also used by staff to carry out routine maintenance works. Again the plant income generated from these is less than optimal but they are essential for emergency situations.

The small excavators are transported on purpose built trailers that have a Gross Vehicle Mass (GVM) or maximum carrying capacity of 3.5 tonne. The gross weight of excavator, associated fittings and trailer is, on average, just less than 3.0 tonne. They are towed by either the small 7 tonne tip truck or by a four wheel drive utility that has a towing capacity of at least 3.0 tonne. These four wheel drive utilities are used by field staff to undertake their day to day duties and provide them with the ability to access rural mains. They also provide staff with quick response capabilities by way of ready access to an appropriate vehicle with which to transport the small excavators to work sites. As stated above changes within the motor vehicle industry are reducing the number of four wheel drive vehicles available to meet these requirements.

Council does not have a policy on local purchasing although staff endeavour to use local suppliers where appropriate. Given the aforementioned changes within the motor vehicle industry, particularly with respect to four wheel drive utilities, the number of dealers within the GWCC area is limited. These dealers have an advantage when the servicing of vehicles is taken into consideration. To further limit competition by only having "local" dealers on a preferred tender list would not be in the best business interests of Council. The Draft Plant Procurement Policy has therefore made no provision for "local" dealers so that all tenders can be considered on merit.

#### Recommendation

- 1. That the draft Plant Procurement Policy, CP025 be adopted.
- 2. That Council endorse the use of Plant Tender Documents similar to the examples tabled at the meeting when calling for Tenders/Quotations for the disposal of and/or supply of items of plant.

**NB:** The above resolution (Minute 10/034) was an amendment to the original pricing structure and budget contained in the 2010/13 Draft Management Plan presented to Council.

# Report prepared by General Manager

The Draft Management Plan for 2010/13 (the Plan) has been prepared and a copy is enclosed with the business paper. The Plan differs from previous years in that the format and content has been standardised in-line with Council's Draft Strategic Business Plan (SBP) with additional explanation / information where required. The draft SBP has been on public display and is included in this business paper for final adoption (refer item 9.3.3).

The Plan includes the Objectives and Strategies identified in the SBP as well as the Actions and Performance Targets that Goldenfields will strive to achieve. The inclusions of these provide Council with a self assessment process through which it can monitor its performance. It also provides stakeholders, both existing and potential, and the general public with information of Council's policy position in respect of many of the day to day issues that arise.

Included in the Management Plan are Estimates of Income and Expenditure for the next three financial years. Significant factors that have been taken into consideration in preparing these estimates are listed below:

• Estimates of Income and Expenditure - The recurrent works programs have generally remained reasonably consistent with those voted for 2009/10, except where known or well-informed estimates have been able to be obtained or calculated. Materials have generally been increased by 2% in line with CPI.

The wages estimate (\$4.6m) has been calculated allowing for a 3.5% increase. This allows for an anticipated industry increase and employee re-grades that occur during the year.

Depreciation (\$6m) has been increased by 3% to allow for the annual asset revaluation process. Electricity (\$2m) and Chemical Costs (\$0.4m) make up a majority of the remaining expenditure essential to continued operations.

- Developer (Infrastructure) Charges have been amended in line with the adopted Development Servicing Plans (DSP). As the current DSP expires at the end of the 2010/11 year, provision for a review of the DSP has been allowed for and will be undertaken over the next twelve months.
- Pricing Structure The Plan continues to apply Best Practice Pricing (BPP) principles as previously adopted by Council. It assumes that water sales will be similar to previous years and takes into consideration the possibility that water allocations, determined by the NSW Office of Water, may be less than 100% of license entitlements. An 8% increase in access charges and a 5% increase in consumption charges have been proposed. The following table shows the variation in charges for 2009/10 and 2010/11 in general terms.

Residential and non-residential customers with meter sizes larger than 20mm will be charged an access charge in accordance with the size of their connection. Access charges for larger connections are detailed in section 5.1.4.1 of the Plan. Larger volume users will pay \$2.40/kl after having used 600kl during the water billing year.

 Capital Works Program – The three year Capital Works Program is based on Council's adopted 30 year Capital Works Program with some minor adjustment to the timing of projects. It is anticipated that some projects within the 2009/10 Program will continue into 2010/11 and unexpended votes at the end of the year will be carried forward subject to the approval of Council. A detailed report on these projects will be submitted to Council for consideration at the end of the current financial year.

It should be noted that the Cowangs Reservoir to Bauloora Reservoir Pipeline Replacement project has been bought forward as a result of Council's successful application for a Federal Government grant. Grant funding of \$7.5m under the Strengthening Basin Communities Water Savings Initiatives program, matched by Council, will allow the completion of this project in advance of previous timeframes resulting in significant savings to both Council and its customers.

- *Tapping, Service and Meter Charge* The tapping fee for a standard 20mm connection has been increased by \$100 and sizes from 25mm to 50mm have been increased by the same amount. This is still approximately half of the average cost.
- Sundry Fees and Charges Regulatory fees and charges have been changed as advice from the relevant authorities has been received. At the time of preparation, the maximum allowable interest rate on overdue charges has not been released (2009/10 9%). Should advice be received prior to the adoption of the Plan then amendments will be made and reported to Council. Other sundry charges have been amended to better reflect the actual cost of providing the service.

The organisation structure includes amendments approved by Council at its February 2010 meeting and reflects the minimum resources required for Council to continue to provide its adopted levels of service.

# Recommendation

Recommendation made was adopted.

**NB:** The original recommendation catered for amendments to the Draft Management Plan and therefore did not require alteration following the passing of Minute 10/034.

# 9.3.6 GLOBAL POSITIONING (GPS) EQUIPMENT (G75707005)

**10/036 RESOLVED** on the motion of Crs Palmer and O'Brien that Council allocate \$20,665 in the current 2009/10 budget for the purchase of a Trimble GeoXH.

# Report prepared by Manager Engineering

The necessary tool for surveying, mapping, preparing works as executed plans and setting out projects was initially the optical theodolite, then the total station which is an electronic/optical theodolite integrated with an electronic distance meter and now enhanced GPS accuracy enables general surveying to be carried out quickly with hand held equipment.

The cost of a total station and target prisms (generally a 2 man team and restricted to line of sight and walking between stations) with an accuracy of about 2 mm is approximately \$14000.

GPS Trials were recently carried out with both a Trimble GeoXH \$20,665 and Topcon GRS-1 \$25,280, with the Trimble being the preferred unit having a demonstrated accuracy ranging from 6mm to 59 mm for 4 accessible benchmarks in Temora. Prices for both included the GPS unit plus associated aerial, software, maps, aerial photographs and training.

# Recommendation

Recommendation made was adopted.

# 9.3.7 TEMORA EAST RESERVOIR (G95258520)

**10/037 RESOLVED** on the motion of Crs O'Brien and Palmer that Council allocate \$16,000 in the current 2009/10 budget for the installation of cathodic protection to the Temora East Reservoir, to be funded from within the current Reservoir Maintenance Budget.

#### Report prepared by Manager Engineering

During routine cleaning of the reservoir in September 2009, rust blisters were discovered in the lower panels of the reservoir, whilst these were repaired promptly by the contractor, PMT Water Engineering, the cause was not obvious.

PMT Water Engineering appointed Corrosion Specialists Pty Ltd to investigate the corrosion, after carrying out electrical conductivity tests they have recommended the installation of a 3 stage "impressed current" cathodic protection system. The cost, estimated to be \$32,000 will be shared 50/50% between PMT Water Engineering and GWCC, i.e. each contributing \$16,000.

#### Recommendation

Recommendation made was adopted.
